


Ex-Winnipeg Transit #751 sported over 6000+ LED lights for the Santa Claus Parade.



William A. (Bill) Luke has been involved in the bus industry for entire life. He grew up in northern Minnesota and began his career working for the Jefferson Transportation Company (now Jefferson Lines) based in Minneapolis.

After 20 years at Jefferson, Bill moved to Spokane, Washington to become the assistant manager of Empire Lines. He has also served as a transit commissioner for the City of Spokane. Together with his wife, Adelene, Bill establish **Bus Ride** magazine in 1965, which has become the prominent trade journal of the bus industry. Bill has travelled extensively across the United States, Canada and 70 countries around the world exploring, learning and writing about bus transportation.

The Luke's sold the publication in 1996, however Bill continues to travel, serve as a consultant and write. He is the author of numerous books about the bus industry and its history.

Bill and Adeline have been married since 1953 and still live in Spokane.

Bill has graciously shared many of his fine photographs with the MTHA. Once again it gives us great pleasure to offer you a look at a second group of his pictures, included in this issue are prints of Greyhound Canada, Winnipeg Transit and various local Manitoba bus companies.


