Plans are to do more cleaning and organizing in the blister storage areas. The question arose of what to do with the spare V-8 engines? Ross suggested that he will find a buyer for them.

Bus 565 requires an exhaust system and the suggestion was made to find a shop that may donate the work. The vehicle also requires some wiring work.

New Business

Alex Regiec announced that work nights would be on Wednesdays and business meetings on the third Tuesday of every month. (Schedules appeared in last edition of the Switch Iron).

MTHA founding member and long time friend Ken Graham passed on September 10th. Ken was dedicated to bus preservation and donated many hours working on restoration projects on Wednesday nights. Some MTHA members attended his funeral.

Dennis Cavanagh mentioned that bus 28, recently donated to the MTHA from Beaver Bus Lines, has been noted to be one of the longest running busses in continuous transit service in North America.
