Everything from basic oil & fluid changes to electrical wiring to engine and drive train work will be undertaken this year.


Members and volunteers are welcomed to participate in work parties to be held on Wednesdays and some Saturdays at FRG.

Transit history book to be published

The Board of Directors of the Manitoba Transit Heritage Association Inc. formally endorsed a project to undertake the research, writing and publication of a history book detailing the transit buses that operated in Greater Winnipeg from 1918 to the present.

The book, to be called "City Streets to Suburban Centres: A History of Transit Buses in the Greater Winnipeg Area" will feature stories, black & white and colour pictures, maps and samples of various transit related items such as passes, tickets and transfers. The MTHA hopes to have the book available by Christmas 2008.





Cincinnati bus operator visits MTHA

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 19:05.

Review of Minutes

The minutes of the 10th October 2007 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's Report

No report at this time.

Old Business

Bus Maintenance:

- Bus 111 requires an oil & fluid change, and need to investigate the squealing noise (differential?)
- Bus 751 also requires oil & fluids change, greasing, under body inspection, corroded panel replacement, and painting.
- Bus 28 needs an under body inspection, frame inspection and application of vinyl decals.

Bus Refurbishment:

- -Bus 214 needs the seats installed, the engine and drive train installed, bumpers, and brake valve work.
- Bus 565 requires completion of the electrical wiring, and an exhaust and muffle system installed.
- Bus 1768 need to move trolley to FRG and begin cleaning and preparation for painting. Need to contact TRAMS in Vancouver regarding electrical restoration.

Bus Insurance & Licencing:

Alex Regiec motioned to purchase the insurance policies for buses 111, 751 & 28. John Panting seconded. Adopted.

Bus Acquisitions:

- Bus 951 maybe available for purchase from the Winnipeg Fire Paramedic Service.
- Bus 107 maybe available from Winnipeg Transit when it is no longer required for service.

Schedules

Work nights would be on Wednesdays, with a slect few on Saturday afternoons and business meetings on the second Thursday of every month.

New Business

The Manitoba Transit Heritage Association has the opportunity to participate in a number of special events this year. The following items were discussed:

Show & Shine Activities:

- Buses 111 & 28 possibly operate a portion of the Selkirk run to acknowledge the 100th Anniversary of the route in May.
- Bus 111 & 751 to appear at the City of Winnipeg's Public Works Expo held at Kildonan Park in May.
- -Bus 111 & 28 to participate in the Cruz' In Downtown parade of vintage vehicles.
- -Bus 28 to be used to deliver hampers for the Christmas Cheer Board in 2008.

Revenue Raising Opportunities:

- Bus 111 could be used to show & Shine at various seniors and nursing homes this summer. Ross Smith and Alex Regiec will coordinate.
- Bus 565 to be used to conduct downtown Heritage Tours in association with Heartland International Tours. A detailed proposal was presented to undertake the Wednesday senior shuttle bus for the Gwen Secter Creative Living Centre using bus 751. The work would
- involve operating 52 days per year for remuneration. Alex Regiec motioned that the MTHA undertake the shuttle work as proposed. Terry Wark seconded. Defeated 11-2.
- -Aproposal to operate a 1 night shuttle for the upcoming Canadian Institute of Planners Conference using buses 751, 28 and 111 was presented. A donation would be made to the MTHA. Ian Moore motioned that the MTHA undertake the 1 night shuttle. Ross Smith seconded. Adopted.
- -Alex Regiec motioned that the MTHA undertake the writing and publication of a book entitled "City Street to Suburban Centres: A History of Transit Buses In Greater Winnipeg" as a fundraiser. David Wyatt seconded. Adopted.
- -A request to bring bus 111 to St. Andrews Church on Canada Day was declined because it was outside the city.

Other Items

Ross Smith raised the possibility of hosting a bus convention, and will explore the idea with Dennis Cavanagh.

Meeting Adjourned

The meeting was adjourned at 21:00.


